Greetings in Our Lord and Blessed Lady!

It's been a long time since I've written to you (and perhaps my first one to you newer members), but I'm sure you are faithfully performing your duties as a Prayer Crusader for Priests. Those of you who are familiar with my letters know that I try to make the letter more interesting by sending you gifts within (hence this Litany



of Our Lady card). I apologize for the small type on the card; it's the only way it would fit correctly without the page folds appearing in the wrong places. Okay, now for words of wisdom...

An Apostolate is a means for God to give Grace. We, the members of the Apostolate, provide the outward means, but God, Himself, gives the internal Grace. Thus, we work together - God and us. He sees our efforts and adds the effectiveness. But being God (and you know how He can be!), we don't normally get to see the effectiveness of our work. He works this way on purpose so that we will continue to act purely in Faith and trusting in Him. If we saw the effects directly, then we would be tempted to believe it to be our actions that are actually accomplishing something and would feel like great wizards. But the truth is that our actions don't really do anything in themselves - they only urge Him to do things. You might say, that our actions actually do accomplish something - but only indirectly. But, since the goal of our apostolate is to acquire Grace for priests in particular, I'm sure we would all give Grace if we had it to give. But we know that only God has Grace to give, and so we labour at getting Him to give it. That is the purpose of our Apostolate, and God will bless us as well for the labour. We must never be fooled into thinking He ignores our prayers and efforts. We only have so much valuable time here on Earth - and He knows this - and when we spend it on endeavours like this, He can't help but to love us for it.

The PCP is an easy pursuit. The obligations are minimal and simple and easy to fulfill. A lot is done with little effort and it easily fits into your daily routine. You are a Crusader out of pure devotion - for there can be no other motive, and I hope you continue faithfully as you have been!
